Mr. President,

While the world is witnessing the worst humanitarian catastrophe in Yemen, which has been proven by international reports and the reports of the expert team and human rights and humanitarian organizations at the present time, the countries of aggression against Yemen were not satisfied with the war crimes and bombing that affected thousands of innocent Yemenis during eight years, but to this day they are still looting the wealth of the Yemen people, oil and gas in clear violation of all international conventions and norms.

The looting of the wealth of the Yemeni people by the countries of aggression is in violation of the International Covenant on Economic Rights of the United Nations, which stipulates in Article 1, paragraph 2, that all peoples, in pursuit of their own goals, freely dispose of their wealth and natural resources without prejudice to any obligations arising from the requirements of cooperation International economic based on the principle of mutual benefit and international law. In no case may a people be deprived of its own means of subsistence.
